About ENSMOV

ENSMOV (Enhancing the Implementation and Monitoring and Verification practices of Energy Saving Policies under Article 7 of the Energy Efficiency Directive (EED)) is a project designed to support public authorities and key stakeholders in EU Member States and accession countries to monitor, revise, improve and complement the design and implementation of their national energy efficiency policies by developing resources on practical and strategic issues arising from the Article 7 of the EED.

Why ENSMOV?

The implementation of the Article 7 of the EED by the EU and its Member States (MS) has shown so far that public authorities have limited time and resources to coordinate experience sharing. Their focus is rather on designing, implementing, monitoring, reporting and evaluating their own national policies and their ability to research and adopt successful policy implementation approaches from other MS is quite limited. However, national authorities and market stakeholders have consistently welcomed the opportunity to share experiences, policy implementation challenges and solutions specifically with regards to energy efficiency obligations (EEOs) and alternative measures and monitoring and verification (MRV) schemes.

What will ENSMOV do?

ENSMOV will focus on addressing:

- issues related to policy (re)design and implementation of the EED;
- MRV issues as a means to policy redesign.

ENSMOV will provide tailored policy support to MS and facilitate in-depth exchange of experience and collaboration among key stakeholders involved in the implementation of the Article 7 EED policies through appropriate, integrated and complementary channels, such as a **knowledge transfer platform, online tools and resources, webinars, workshops and bilateral knowledge exchanges at national, regional and EU level**. In addition, **ENSMOV will assist national authorities' in-house monitoring, reporting and verification (MRV) schemes with a view to ensuring they have robust data and insight to inform the (re)design of policies towards 2030**.



ENSMOV knowledge exchange programme

The knowledge exchange programme has been structured in a way to capture and transfer knowledge on policy redesign and MRV for Article 7 EED to public authorities and stakeholders.
